Featuring: Ian Lockwood, Livable Transportation Engineer, Toole Design Group

As historic downtowns become increasingly popular, the debate regarding parking and transportation also increases. Valid concerns regarding business and customer parking opportunities are topics of common discussion, as small towns seek to grow and accommodate more residents. Join us as we learn how successful parking strategies have been utilized nationally, protecting sense of place and bolstering the local economy.

Ian Lockwood P.E., is a Harvard University Loeb Fellow and studied at Carleton University, earning Bachelor and Masters Degrees in Civil Engineering. Ian specializes in active transportation, place-making, and helping cities through collaborative planning, design and engineering. He has led a wide variety of transportation projects aimed at making communities more walkable, bikeable, and transit-friendly. In the 1990s, he led some of the first arterial calming projects in the country. In 2005, Ian helped define the term “complete streets,” an idea about inclusive design which is now widely practiced in North America. Ian’s projects range from designing flexible-use public spaces to highway removal projects, all with the goal of increasing social and economic exchange.
